

Graduate Research Assistantship Initiative for Digital Humanities, Media, and Culture (IDHMC)

The Initiative for Digital Humanities, Media, and Culture seeks to hire a Graduate Research Assistant (GAR) for the Spring 2017 semester to facilitate faculty outreach and develop activities for its Humanities Visualization Space (HVS). The GAR will report to the director, Dr. Laura Mandell.

The job duties include:

1. Working with faculty on formulating digital humanities projects and grant-fundable projects, and then setting up meetings between them and IDHMC staff;
2. Helping faculty with their projects technically (no prior skills needed; training provided);
3. Holding workshops and events to show faculty possibilities for using digital tools (familiarity with or eagerness to learn SCALR, Voyant, and using the HVS big screen).

This is a graduate research position as defined by the University, and GARs will be required to work an average of 20 hours per week. Tuition waivers will not be provided for Master's students, per CLA policy, and potential tuition waivers for PhD students will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
